DRILLING FOR DIAMONDS RESUMES AT SHELL LAKES WESTERN AUSTRALIA

A first pass air core drilling program designed to test eight magnetic anomalies for diamond bearing kimberlite pipes resumed today.

Only one hole of the program was completed last year, which intersected a large para kimberlite pipe similar to rocks with close spatial relationships to diamond bearing kimberlites in some districts of Africa, North America and Russia. This intersection heralded the discovery of a new field of para kimberlitic pipes, which, like the Argyle diamond pipe, lie along a major continental gravity lineament known as the Mundrabilla Fault.

The current hole is testing target 7, some 60 kilometres north east of the first hole (Figure 1) and the drilling program is expected to be completed in late March.

This program is being funded and operated by the Company's joint venture partner, De Beers Australia Exploration Ltd, who have the right to earn 51% of the diamond rights to the Project by spending \$2.5 million in 3 years from 9 April 2002.
