Project Haber Update

- Globally recognised ammonia/urea engineer, Technip Energies, has been awarded the Front-End Engineering for Strike's Project Haber, 1.4 mtpa low carbon urea fertiliser development.
- Wood has been awarded the Owner's Engineering package.
- Environmental referrals submitted to EPA as part of the permit approval process.

Strike Energy Limited (Strike - ASX: STX) is pleased to provide an update on its flagship low carbon fertiliser development Project Haber. The development is situated on the Company's wholly owned freehold land in Western Australia's wheatbelt region and directly above its 100% owned South Erregulla gas field, which will provide the energy feedstock to the project.

Front End Engineering & Design (FEED)

After a competitive tender process Strike has awarded the FEED to Technip Energies (T.EN). T.EN is the global leader in engineering and design of ammonia/urea facilities and has worked extensively with Strike's selected key technology providers: Topsoe (Autothermal Reforming & Ammonia Synthesis), Saipem (Urea Synthesis) and ThyssenKrupp (Urea Granulation). Strike selected these technologies as they facilitate the highest degree of energy efficiency and lowest carbon emissions possible for urea production.

T.EN has recently executed the design and construction of several reference plants of similar capacity, thereby enabling T.EN to efficiently complete the engineering works on Project Haber, which are currently estimated to take 9-10 months from commencement.

Strike and T.EN have executed a project establishment call off order to commence preparation for the formal FEED to start and for Project Haber to enter Strike's 'Define' phase. Strike expects to enter its 'Define' phase once key licensor technology agreements are in place, which is expected to occur in the coming quarter in parallel with closing out the Project Haber predevelopment financing process.

Owners Engineering

The Project Haber team awarded the Owner's Engineering package to Wood. As owner's engineer, Wood will provide technical and engineering oversight services for the duration of the project to monitor and assess the work in progress, ensuring the Engineering, Procurement and Construction contractor delivers work consistent with the project's requirements

Environmental Approval Permit Submission

Strike has submitted the environmental referral for Project Haber together with the appropriate supporting documentation required for its key Part IV environmental approvals to WA's Environmental Protection Agency. These approvals are expected to be the longest lead item in preparing Project Haber for financial close prior to a construction commitment. The environmental referral has been prepared in partnership with Strategen JBS&G.

Chief Executive Officer & Managing Director, Stuart Nicholls said:

"Todays' announcement marks the conclusion of months of work and the start of an exciting period for Strike's flagship low carbon fertiliser development known as Project Haber. The



design of this state-of-the-art facility will enable Australia to take control of its own supply of urea fertiliser in partnership with reducing its primary agricultural emissions. Project Haber stands to be a centrepiece of Australia's energy transition where technology, resources and renewable energy come together."

About Project Haber

Project Haber is Strike's proposed vertically integrated low carbon urea fertiliser facility. Haber will utilise globally low-cost gas from Strike's 100% owned South Erregulla onshore Perth Basin gas field whilst incorporating the best global technology with renewable energy integration to generate nitrogen-based fertiliser that is estimated to be 50-60% less carbon intensive than the fertiliser currently imported and consumed across Australia's broadacre farms. The facility is proposed to be constructed on Strike's 100% owned freehold land directly above Strike's 100% owned South Erregulla gas field, which is in WA's Mid West and part of the State's large wheatbelt region, where ~40% of the fertiliser produced by Haber is expected to be consumed in the immediate vicinity. Haber has established an export route for its remaining ~60% of product that will utilise the Geraldton Port to access valuable fertiliser markets on the East Coast of Australia or within the region. Haber will re-domesticate the manufacturing of this critical agricultural commodity here in Australia and will also provide a feedstock for vital Diesel Exhaust Fluid (commonly referred to as AdBlue) where urea is the primary ingredient.
