Answer: Yes. Expenditure in the current quarter reported is representative of the Company's current and expected level of net operating cash flows. The figure was higher in the current quarter (compared to the prior quarter) because of a significant drilling campaign completed at the Dassa deposit in Burkina Faso. The Company's planned exploration work for the next quarter will be adjusted based on the quantum of existing funds and new funds arising via a raising.
