QUARTERLY ACTIVITIES REPORT FOR THE PERIOD ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

Exploration

- Retention Licence application, R52/10, covering both the Wodger and Forest copper resources, (24Mt at 1.7% Cu for 41,500t Cu¹), and area of potential mining infrastructure within the Forrest Project was submitted and granted.
- Subsequent to the reporting period, E52/1659 and E52/1671, were withdrawn from the Forrest Project JV with Westgold.
- Auris continues to sell surplus assets and reduce expenditure commitments and costs where possible while strategically advancing high-quality targets within the Bryah Basin and assessing new complementary project opportunities.

• Cash balance at 31 December 2024 of ~\$1.34M.

Gold and base metals explorer **Auris Minerals Limited** ("**Auris**" or "**the Company**") (**ASX: AUR**) is pleased to provide its Quarterly Activities Report for the quarter ended 31 December 2024.

Commenting on the December quarter, Auris Managing Director, Mike Hendriks said:

"We are pleased to have obtained a retention licence over the Forrest and Wodger copper deposits as this along with the withdrawal of the supporting exploration licences will reduce our annual exploration commitment on the Forrest Project by \$100,000 while retaining our interests in the prospective copper resource as we review how best to maximise value for shareholders from these deposits.

We thank Westgold for their support in achieving the retention licence which they retain a 20% interest and for allowing us to store the Forrest drill core at Fortnum, enabling Auris to relinquish our warehouse lease at Bibra Lake which expires 31 March 2025. This along with further cost cutting measures will ensure our existing cash reserves are best utilised on key targets in the existing portfolio, and potential new opportunities which we continue to assess."

Company Overview




Figure 1: Auris' copper-gold exploration tenement portfolio, with Westgold (WGX) and CuFe Ltd JV areas indicated (as of 31 December 2024)

Auris is exploring for base metals and gold in the Bryah Basin of Western Australia. Auris has consolidated a tenement portfolio of 285km², which is divided into three well-defined project areas: Forrest, Doolgunna and Morck Well, (Figure 1).

Auris manages exploration on all tenements, including those that are subject to arrangements with third parties.

EXPLORATION

1. FORREST PROJECT (80% AUR, 20% WGX)

The Forrest Project includes tenements E52/1659, E52/1671 and now, R52/10, which host the Wodger and Forrest copper deposits and fall under an agreement with Westgold Resources Limited ("WGX") whereby WGX own all gold rights and a 20% free carried interest until a decision to mine for all copper rights.

During the reporting period, retention licence application, R52/10, covering both the Wodger and Forrest copper resources and area of potential mining infrastructure area was submitted. Subsequent to the quarter end, on 6 January 2025, retention license R52/10 was granted, (80% Auris, 20% Westgold).

On 1 January 2025, the remaining portions of exploration licences, E52/1659 and E52/1671, which were not consumed by the grant of the retention licence, were withdrawn from the joint venture with Westgold.

The above actions result in Auris retaining its 80% interest in both the Wodger and Forrest copper resources whilst reducing the financial obligations of the project by reducing annual commitments for the project by \$100,000.




Figure 2: Forrest Project tenement portfolio

The Company had a cash position of ~\$1.34M at 31 December 2024.

The \$82,000 amount of exploration and evaluation expenditure capitalised (and expensed), is comprised of expenditure relating to geological staff salaries, tenement administration and maintenance and project evaluation.

Details of mining production and development activities

No production and development activities were undertaken during the quarter.

Details of tenement activities

Application for extension of term for E52/1672 for a further 1 year was granted on 10 December 2024. Application for extension of term for E51/1033 for a further 1 year was granted on 10 December 2024. Application for extension of term for E52/1671 for a further 1 year was applied for on 18 November 2024.

Application for retention licence, R52/10, was submitted on 28 October 2024. Retention licence, R52/10, was grated on 6 January 2025 for a period of 5 years.

Details of related party payments

The aggregate amount of payments to related parties and their associates included in the current quarter Cash flows from operating activities was \$55,000, comprising Directors fees and superannuation.
